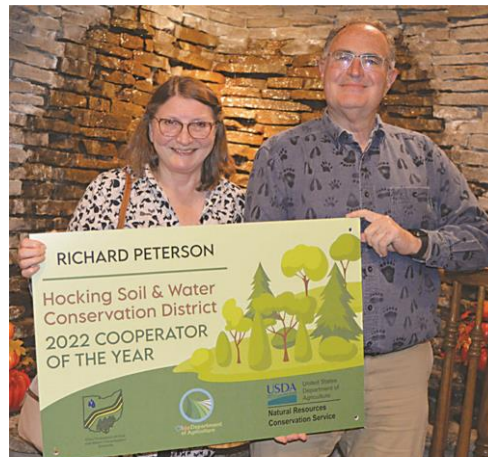

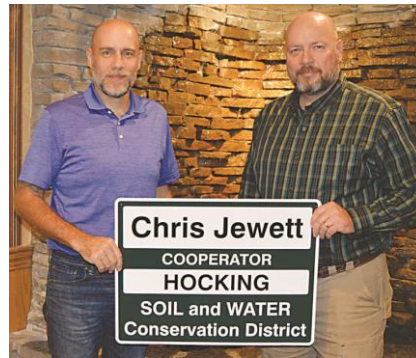


Eddie Ogle -Cooperator Award

Other conservation practices installed over the years include roof runoff system, fencing for rotational grazing, spring developments for livestock & a nutrient management plan.

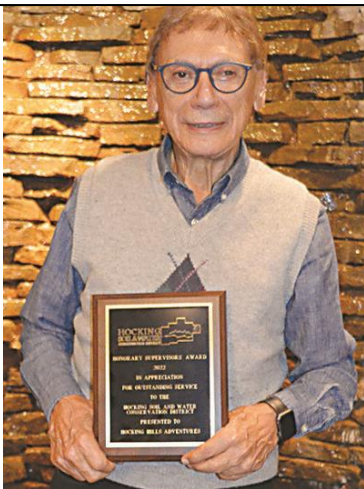
The Jewett Family -Cooperator Award

Chris & Mike Jewett manage 104 acres of mixed hardwood. In 2018, they wanted to start improving their woods and received funding from EQIP to hire a certified forester to write a Forest Management Plan. In 2019 they began to treat invasive species with the assistance of EQIP funding. They are actively working through each section of their property to help improve the overall health of their woodland.



Mira Burns -Youth Service Award

Mira started the recycling program at the Logan High School and this past year joined in as our Youth Representative on the Logan In Bloom Committee. Whenever there is a litter cleanup, planting event, or help needed, she is there for us spreading the word to her peers. We simply send an email and she is on top of it.
